Dear Bolinas-Stinson School Community,

As I often do, I want to lead with an expression of gratitude. Thank you to all the great teachers and staff of our little school for taking such great care of our children each and every day.

End of Year Activities:

We have several things going on in various classes, but I want to communicate about two specific school-wide events.

On **Wednesday June 13th** we are taking our K-7th grade students to the Bear Valley Visitor Center picnic area for a “Step Up” celebration and lunch. All parents and families are invited. Please look for a permission slip that went home on Thursday that has specific details. Please note that the school day will start as normal on both campuses, and afternoon busses will be on the normal schedule as well. Essentially, we are taking students to a nice picnic area to do a simple ceremony acknowledging the movement from one grade to the next, asking them to do a reflection on the year and to set a goal for next year. We will have a picnic lunch, play a bit, and then drive back to the Bolinas campus. It will be simple and hopefully meaningful and fun. All are welcome. (Except 8th graders, who will stay on the Bolinas campus and prepare for graduation the next day.) Please also remember that since we will be in a wooded area which is home to amazing deer (it’s fawning season) it is always good to check your children for ticks afterwards.

Thursday June 14 is our 8th grade graduation ceremony. As a way to bring the whole school community together, we bring all of our classes to the ceremony. Which means it is a school day. It is the last day of school, and it is a school day. (Do you see that I am encouraging attendance here?) In the past many K-7 students haven't come to school on graduation day which eliminates any chance for the class to have some closure for the year in the morning before the graduation ceremony begins. We would love to have all of our students present for the last day of school, even dressed up just a bit, as a way to come together as a whole school and honor our graduates. COMING FALL 2018

The Young Stewards of the Land is an after school program that teaches students skills in land stewardship and community care. Local specialists offer expertise through hands-on, cooperative learning experiences in the West Marin outdoors, empowering students to care for themselves, one another, the land, and the community.

The program will begin August 31st 2018 for 5th-8th graders every Friday from 3pm-6pm. Applications go out August 1st, tuition is \$36 per week AND **scholarship money is available!** Please send request for applications and scholarships to Bostinyoungstewards@gmail.com.

The program for 2018-2019 is led by *USF Professor Melinda Stone* and Steering Committee of school parents: *Meadow Evans, Veena Lucas, Chelsie Fontan-Walker and Lia Sabbatini*. The program includes layers of mentorship; USF students, middle school students, and elementary students with community specialists. Partners include *Star Route and Gospel Flat Farms, Commonweal Gardens with Anna O'Malley, Audubon Canyon, Bolinas Fire Department, and the BPUD Land Stewards*. Local artists, artisans, naturalists, and primitive skills experts will make up our specialists teaching the youth. Themes for this coming year are for the fall: **Learning the Land**, winter: **Tending the Hearth** and spring: **Walking on the Wild Side**.

Activities include everything from learning about our local flora and fauna, farming, cooking with the Cobb oven, outdoor survival and ancestral skills, CPR, making herbal 1st aid kits, elder and baby care, cooking and food deliveries to people in need, fire safety at firehouse, orienteering, bicycling and bike trail repair, kayaking, water safety and a fun end-of-the-year campout! We have even more activities in the works for the program!



The Bolinas Stinson Union School District Summer School Program offers a free, academic remedial and enrichment program to first through sixth grade Bolinas Stinson students. The program offers 63 hours of individualized, intensive academic instruction and a free daily snack and lunch. The BSUSD Summer School Program also offers consultation with classroom teachers, pre- and post- summer school assessment and three enrichment fieldtrips.

This year the summer program will focus on review and practice of grade level California Common Core Standards English Language Arts and Math. Students will also use web based Learning Ally to access ebook literature and Lexia for phonics, fluency and sight word practice and Dreambox for Math practice. Students will have the opportunity to practice coding using Code.org and Scratch. Summer school students will also spout and plant in one of the school garden beds.



El Programa Escolar de Verano del Distrito Escolar Stinson Union de Bolinas ofrece un programa de enriquecimiento y remediación académico gratuito para los estudiantes de Bolinas Stinson de primero a sexto grado. El programa ofrece 63 horas de instrucción académica individualizada e intensiva y una merienda y almuerzo diario gratuitos. El Programa de Escuela de Verano de BSUSD también ofrece consultas con los maestros de aula, evaluación de la escuela antes y después del verano y tres excursiones de enriquecimiento.

Este año, el programa de verano se enfocará en la revisión y la práctica de los estándares básicos comunes de California para las artes del lenguaje en inglés y matemáticas. Los estudiantes también utilizarán Learning Ally basado en la web para acceder a la literatura del ebook y Lexia para la fonética, la fluidez y la práctica de la palabra vista y Dreambox para la práctica de matemáticas. Los estudiantes tendrán la oportunidad de practicar la codificación usando Code.org y Scratch. Los estudiantes de la escuela de verano también verterán y plantarán en una de las camas del jardín de la escuela.


